TRU TECHNOLOGY SPOTLIGHT TRU-LY THE BEST

The company's TRU innovations have been road-tested through the most extreme conditions across the continent—and with more than 30,000 units on the road today, they have a proven track record of success.

Utility Trailer is proud to be the exclusive distributor of Cargobull North America's latest TRU products on its 3000R reefer trailers. Combined with Utility's proven innovations, dedicated focus on safety, and its powerful dealer network, TRU technology is primed to take a giant leap forward in North America.

The exciting, state-of-the-art debut lineup includes:

- 625 Hybrid Mono (Single-Temperature) Hybrid TRU
- 655MT Hybrid Multi-Temp Hybrid TRU

To help fleets get even further ahead of emission regulations and push the envelope to be more eco-friendly, Cargobull North America will also soon offer e625 and e655MT models—fully electric, TUV-homologated TRUs with a battery-recuperation axle.

Lowering emissions through sustainable technology is already a priority and quickly becoming a driving force in the refrigerated trailer industry as US states continue to tighten regulations.

Cargobull North America's existing TRU technology already meets California's emissions standards for 2030. It's also compliant with the California Air Resources Board's (CARB) ultra-low emission TRU (ULETRU) regulations without the use of a problematic diesel particulate filter (DPF) or exhaust gas recirculation valve. And because the units can be plugged in at a loading dock, emissions are lowered while cooling efficiencies are maximized.

Another competitive advantage stems from leveraging a smaller, reliable Hatz industrial diesel engine with fuel-sipping common rail injection—combining the industry's most-reliable engine with the lowest-possible fuel consumption.

The hybrid powertrain directly couples the diesel engine and generator for further reliability with no need for drive belt or clutch maintenance. Fully embedded shore power from the hybrid powertrain also completely eliminates local diesel emissions. Lastly, all noise-dampening options come standard for quieter loading docks and the quietest diesel operation available in North America.

Utility Trailer Connect telematics are the central nervous system of Cargobull North America's new TRU technology. Fully integrated and not just an aftermarket add-on, the UTC-TABS8 series ensures loads are more secure and unwanted surprises are a thing of the past. Fleets enjoy a seamless, comprehensive, and better handle on both trailer and unit maintenance issues that can impact fuel efficiency, uptime, security, driver safety, and load quality control—all right at fleet managers' fingertips at any time and anywhere through the Cargobull North America and Utility Trailer Connect telematics portal.

Key benefits include complete surveillance and control over the temperature-controlled transport with 24/7 live TRU monitoring, including fuel status and door-opening monitoring, as well as advanced two-way communication options or smart remote reefer settings. Intelligent geofencing and customizable temperature reporting options are also available, with additional industry-leading technology such as tire-inflation monitoring, remote door lock controls, and vehicle immobilization options on the horizon.

With one click, telematics data can now be streamlined directly to industry-standard frontends, fleet operators, and transport management or enterprise resource planning systems. KROGER GETS FIRST CARGOBULL TRUS IN AMERICA

Utility Trailer has been providing the Kroger family of supermarkets with 3000R refrigerated trailers to their precise specifications for decades. Now, the company will deliver 3000Rs to Kroger with the new, fully integrated single-temp and multi-temp Cargobull North America transport refrigeration units (TRUs)—the 625 and 655MT.

Configured specifically to Kroger's requirements, such as ULETRU certification to accommodate California's clean air requirements, the

TRUs are feature-rich. Additionally, the Utility Trailer Connect telematics system monitors TRU operation, provides predictive maintenance for the TRU, and monitors trailer health.

Coming soon, Utility and Cargobull North America are amalgamating the fully electric TRUs (the e625 and the e655MT) with the 3000R for North American operations. Based on the highly successful electric TRU developed by Schmitz Cargobull in Germany, Utility and Cargobull North America, working with Kroger, are developing the technology in Southern California. The fully electric TRU system, with a recuperation axle and 35 kWh battery, is currently operating throughout Europe, South Africa, Australia, and New Zealand and was unveiled and displayed at the IFDA Solutions Expo in Fort Worth, Texas.

Steve Bennett, President & COO of Utility, stated, "Kroger, and their Southern California-based operations, provide us with an optimum testing environment for our fully electric solution. As battery technology develops, the need for a recuperation axle might be diminished. Until that time, we have an exceptional solution with the Cargobull recuperation axle."


